- Members attended a meeting of Hurst community groups to coordinate a response to object to the proposed development in the Tape Lane field.
- JE/LR attended a meeting with Willson Developments to explore their intentions for the Amen corner site inside our parish. We were given a copy of their submission to WBC for the LPU.
- JE/LR visited Cosmographics and tasked them with a new parish map and three potential ASC areas. They will bill us for this work.
- A meeting to discuss biodiversity areas has still to be arranged with WBC.
- The protected species in the TVERC list are still to be identified.

199 Update and feedback on WBC LPU

WBC was still in the process of evaluating a few thousand responses to their updated Local Plan.

200 Road traffic surveys

- BT was in the process of compiling the results of over 90 traffic surveys conducted between 2012 and 2019. Latest surveys will be conducted in the summer.
- The RTA data for the past 20 years was also now available for analysis and sites will be plotted on the parish map.

201 Timeline going forward

- The Group was preparing an evidence base to support objections to the Tape Lane field development.
- Some Outsourcing contracts are still to be finalised.
- The general evidence base continues to be refined and policies to be formulated.
